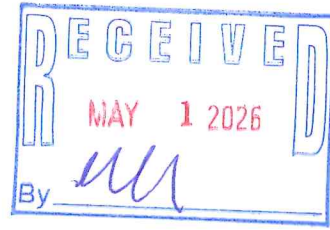

Dear Connecticut Department of Transportation,

I am writing on behalf of the Town of Morris regarding the proposed roundabout at the intersection of Routes 109 and 61 in the center of town.

At their most recent meeting, the Morris Board of Selectmen voted not to support the proposed roundabout design due to concerns about its impact on the character and functionality of the Town Center. After careful consideration, the Board believes the initial proposal presented by the Department would be a more appropriate solution for this location.

Specifically, the Selectmen favor the alternative approach involving a slight realignment of Route 61 and adjustments to bring the stop-controlled intersections on Route 109 closer together. This option is viewed as more consistent with the scale and setting of Morris while still addressing safety and traffic flow needs.

The Town of Morris values its partnership with the Connecticut Department of Transportation and looks forward to continuing to work collaboratively toward an improvement plan that best serves both the local community and the traveling public.

REFUSE DISPOSAL SITE PERMIT POLICY

PURPOSE:

These rules governing the Town of Morris Transfer Station, and the related process for permitting use thereof, are adopted and amended, from time-to-time, by the Board of Selectmen, pursuant to Gen. Stat. § 7-148(c)(4)(H), § 7-148(c)(8), and Morris Code of Ordinances, Chapter 50. The Transfer Station was established to provide Morris residents and qualifying residential taxpayers an area for collection of acceptable solid waste and recyclables, to help control and reduce the amount of solid waste generated within the Town of Morris, and to assist with identifying residential taxpayers of the Town of Morris who shall be eligible. The Board of Selectmen shall determine from time to time the printed color and duration of each permit.

SCOPE:

This policy applies to all permitted residential taxpayers who use the Town of Morris Transfer Station. All users shall adhere to this policy.

POLICY:

The Town of Morris, through the Transfer Station, will issue stickers to approved residential taxpayers who use the Town's Transfer Station. A valid permit sticker is required to use the Transfer Station. The stickers will be issued on a yearly basis. Each year's stickers will be color coded. It is the responsibility of each permittee to have a current sticker **securely adhered to windshield**. The Transfer Station attendant shall deny access to the Transfer Station if the user fails to properly display a valid and current permit sticker. The Transfer Station attendant has full discretion to bar or remove any user who violates any ordinance or rule governing the Transfer Station. The stickers will be issued at the Transfer Station on Wednesday and Saturdays only. **NO PERMIT STICKERS SHALL BE ISSUED ON FRIDAYS OR SUNDAYS.** Pursuant to Morris Code § 50.23(D), approximately May 1st each year, stickers will be available for the upcoming fiscal year which begins July 1st. Each eligible residential taxpayer shall show proof of address within Town of Morris. Each residential taxpayer shall fill out a permit sheet which will include the permit number, name, address, mailing address, phone number, license plate of permitted
