Container Gardening



Containers bursting with flowers and foliage add "wow" to a patio or porch. Don't worry too much about rules—it's important to go with what you like—horticulture is very forgiving. Choose a container with drainage holes, add potting soil and perhaps some slow release fertilizer. Remember clay pots dry out faster than plastic. When thinking of color, consider where your containers will sit—your colors might look different up against a brick wall as opposed to gray shingles.

Thriller, spiller and filler—this is the classic mantra for planting containers. Thrillers are the eyecatchers. Fillers cover the soil, hide the stem of the thriller and add vol-

ume to the design. *Spillers* drape over the edge of the pot, softening the edges and expanding the vertical line.

One plant, one pot—Instead of putting several plants in one pot, consider a grouping of several different pots with one plant in each.

Stick to odd numbers—It's a little bit more natural versus using plants in pairs.

Consider texture and shape—
Foliage also adds texture — shiny, smooth, fuzzy or feathery.
