NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Morris will conduct a public hearing by the Board of Selectmen at the Morris Community Hall, 3 East St, Morris, CT 06763 on Monday May 22, 2023, at 7:00 pm in person and via zoom at

Maximum award limits:

- \$1,500,000 for Public Housing Modernization;
- \$1,000,000 for Infrastructure associated with the development of Affordable Housing.

Major activity categories are: Acquisition, Housing Rehabilitation, Public Housing Modernization, Community Facilities, Public Services, and Economic Development. Projects funded with CDBG allocations must carry out at least one of three National Objectives: benefit to low- and moderate-income persons, elimination of slums and blight, or meeting urgent community development needs.

The purpose of the public hearing is to obtain citizen's views on the Town's community development and housing needs and review and discuss specific project activities in the areas of housing, economic development or community facilities which could be part of the Town's new Application for funding for the year 2023.

The First Selectman on behalf of the Town of Morris anticipates applying for a grant amount of not to exceed \$800,000 under the Affordable Housing Infrastructure Planning, Engineering and Construction eligible activity.

The Town of Morris promotes fair housing and makes all programs available to low- and moderate-income households regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, gender identity or expression, marital status, age, lawful source of income, familial status, learning disability or physical/mental disability, or sexual orientation.
