From the Desk of First Selectman, Meaghan H. Cook

This week has been full of new opportunities to learn.

We started the lessons with what appears to be a weather-related motor vehicle incident involving an Amazon truck fueled by CNG, compressed natural gas. The tank had come off its mounting, concern of potential leaking lead to swift action on the part of our first responders to request the assistance of DEEP to manage the potential hazard. I am told this is the first incident of its kind. Although it took many hours of clean up and significant detours, a successful outcome was reached. Our gratitude is extended to the multiple town and state agencies for their teamwork in this situation.

A member of the community gardens is working with me to submit a Northwest CT Community Foundation Grant request to replace the aging, wooden garden beds.

Last ditch efforts to reinstate a potentially lost road improvement grant are being pursued in cooperation with Army Core of Engineers.

Our first Board of Selectman meeting for 2026 was well attended, the minutes will be posted to the Town website shortly, if not already.

I sat in on a FVHD Food Insecurity Conference in Avon. Debbie Brydon and I were delighted to join the conference with our food bank volunteers, Barbara Hunter, and Elizabeth Martin, also in attendance, to address the growing needs within the Town and the community at large. We will meet again to discuss and implement ways to remove the stigma related to food assistance programs and keeping our neighbors healthy.



Tax Office Information

January 15, 2026

If you purchased a vehicle between the dates of October 2, 2024 and September 30, 2025, you should have received a supplemental tax bill by now. If you think you should have received a bill and have not, call or email the tax office. Payments need to be in the office or postmarked by Monday, February 2, 2026 to avoid interest and penalties.

The second installment of real estate and personal property bills mailed out in June, 2025 are also due and payable by Monday, February 2, 2026. There is no mailing of these tax bills at this time of year – a stub was included with the July stub. Please go online or call if you need a copy.

Last week information was sent out concerning when the post office will be postmarking mail. Please take that into consideration if you are going to mail your tax payment. The tax office is required to take the post office postmark or, in the absence of a postmark, the date of receipt as the date paid. It is best to enter a post office and ask that your envelope be hand cancelled to insure you will not be subject to late penalties if you are paying at the end of the month. Payments made online through your bank DO NOT have a postmark so be sure to schedule your payment to be sent a few days prior to the last day to pay.

Remember to review your check before sending a payment in. Be sure:

- the amount is correct
- the numeric and written portions match and are correct
- the date is correct (2026 now)
- the check is signed.

Also, please be sure the necessary funds are in your account prior to paying the taxes. Many banks process withdrawals first. If we cannot deposit your check and return it, it will be considered late if paid after February 2, 2025.

Tax office hours are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 8:30 – 4:30. Please call or email us if you have any questions.

This approach is a cost-effective way to maintain areas that our roadside mower cannot safely reach. In addition, we plan to remove dead trees in the same area, as well as in other sections of West River Road.


