From the Desk of Meaghan Cook

This week has been jam-packed and productive.

I've reignited conversations with our partners to move forward on two grants already in motion, one for electric vehicle charging stations and another focused on improvements to West River Road. Both projects represent important investments in our town's infrastructure and long-term sustainability, and I'm encouraged by the renewed momentum even if it is at a snail's pace.

On Monday evening, I attended the monthly meeting of the Barkhamsted Historical Society at Squire's Tavern. It's an active and dedicated group committed to preserving our town's historic presence and significant buildings. We had a great conversation about ways we can continue working together to protect and celebrate Barkhamsted's rich history. Paul Hart also rallied additional participants to get creative and submit a chair for the upcoming auction, a wonderful example of community spirit and involvement.

Jim Shanley led a tabletop workshop at Barkhamsted Elementary School to address coordinated response efforts in the event of a potential large-scale incident. Representatives from the school, the Connecticut Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security, Connecticut State Police, Barkhamsted and New Hartford first responders, our Road Crew Foreman, and myself participated. These are the uncomfortable conversations that must be addressed to ensure the best possible outcomes in the face of terrible circumstances. Preparation, communication, and coordination are critical, and I'm grateful for the professionalism and commitment shown by everyone at the table.

Tuesday night brought a well-attended Board of Finance meeting. Did I mention it's budget season? We are deep in the work, reviewing needs, balancing priorities, and focusing on responsible planning for the year ahead. It's a collaborative effort, and we are committed to thoughtful decisions that reflect both fiscal responsibility and the needs of our community.

There is a lot of good work happening across our town. Thank you to everyone who continues to serve, volunteer, participate, and stay engaged as we move Barkhamsted forward together.
