2. Approval of the agenda

5. Potential visit from Brian Blake (CRHS graduate/Dragoon Member) to discuss event
Brian Blake, Corporal with the 2nd Regiment Continental Light Dragoons, was present to give
a brief history on the Dragoons and to discuss a potential encampment event in 2026. B.
Blake explained the Dragoons are part of America's 1st commissioned cavalry and serve the
State of Connecticut as part of the Governors ceremonial guard. He added was raised in
Middlefield and is a 2014 Coginchaug graduate, he still has family in town. He was very
excited to potentially hold an event involving the Dragoons in town.

The Dragoons offer a variety of programs, with a focus on education first, including teaching communities about the American Revolution. Their calvary unit includes horses and can conduct living history combat on both horse and foot.

The members discussed the following:

- a. Hold the event towards the end of October 2026
- b. Weekend event, attendee purchase tickets to attend
- c. Locations: prefer the fairgrounds, noted other locations would include Whites Farm or town green
- d. Estimated total stipend \$900 (approx. \$100 per unit)
 - i. This does not include the cost for food and water to be provided for the units
 - ii. Insurance costs
- e. Recommended to get invites out to the various units before the end of 2025
- f. B. Blake would like to see a multi-year event to 2033 (covers the 7-years of the Revolutionary War)
- g. Question the town needs to answer; policy on encampment, units staying overnight, zoning questions, etc.
