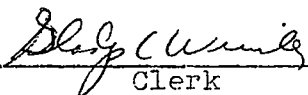
The Selectmen met and paid the bills. Mr. Charles Church, Mr. John Lyman, Jr. and Mr. Mark Snattuzzi from the Regional Board of Education, came to discuss the problems of Maiden Lane conereneing the children walking the road. Many ideas were offered to help the situation, such as widen the road where possible, more lighting, painted white lines and painted school signs on the road, constables, school guards, school signs, and a change of policy by the Regional School Board concerning busing.

Mr. Kerschner made a motion that Mrs. Marion DeTour be appointed to the Library Board to fill the vacancy. Mr. Davis seconded the motion.

Mr. Davis gave a report on the first meeting of the Refuse Disposal Committee.

Mr. Kerschner made a motion that the Selectmen support the recycling of used glass by furnishing containers for use by the Town's people. It was seconded and Mr. Kerschner is going to offer his services to the Committee at the Frank Ward Strong School presently working on the project. Work was begun on the 1971-1972 Budget.

They adjourned until February 18, at 6:00 at which time they make voters.
