The Selectmen met while making voters. Mr. Kerschner was unable to attend due to illness. They reappointed Mr. Driscoll as Dog Warden for the coming year. The Clerk spoke of Durham now being in the Food Stamp Plan and she told of the requirements to become eligible.

Mr. Richard Parmelee had requested that he be able to rent the same Town owned land as he rented last year and Mr. Stender made a motion and Mr. Wimler seconded it, to allow Mr. Parmelee to do this.

Midstate Regional Planning Agency sent forms for the Selectmen to list up to 10 top priority problems for the next ten years. Mentioned to put on the list were the Town Dump, areas of drainage, Sanitary Sewerage disposal, a new Town Hall and a new Fire House, a new Town Garage and more Cemetery Land.

They worked on the Budget and then at 7:30 a delegation from the Fire Dept. came to discuss their problems. It was agreed that the first consideration should be finding property near the Center of Town. They are going to report back to the Selectmen after investigating several pieces that were mentioned.
