This Committee shall be disbanded by a Resolution of the Board of Selectmen after the completion of celebrations in the year 1976.

2. The matter of qualifying town residents for federally-backed flood insurance is now before the Planning & Zoning Commission and the process is expected to take approximately two months. Townspeople will be kept informed.
3. The State has informed the Town that it's request for reimbursement of ice storm expenses has been denied by the federal government and by the state. Ice storm expenses amounted to approximately \$9,000. The First Selectman will repetition the State for assistance, but assistance at this point is considered unlikely.
4. After discussion relative to the significant damage to town roads during the recent rain storm, the meeting was adjourned until Saturday at 2:00 P.M. when the Board will survey the damage before deciding on a course of action. Damage is substantial, and consideration is being given to requesting a release of Revenue Sharing Funds to assist in funding the repair process.
5. A request from the developer of Gaslight Village that acceptance by the town of roadways within the subdivision be placed on the agenda of the next special town meeting is hereby denied pending the developer's full compliance with requirements set forth by the Town Engineer in his memorandums of November 12, 1973 and March 18, 1974.
