

BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING
APRIL 11, 1972

The Board of Selectmen meeting began at 8:05, in the Town Hall April 11, 1972.

Several members of the Recreation Committee, and the Youth Center attended. William Cichese, Chairman of the Recreation Committee, presented his views on the committee combining with the Youth Center to incorporate. He said this would not involve the Town spending money. He suggested after three years, go over the entire program, and then evaluate the program's needs. If they find it wouldn't function efficiently, then they would have to dissolve. After three years he thought the treasury would still be solvent. Mr. Kerschner stated that if a letter were sent to the Selectmen stating that the Youth Center will continue to participate, and that serious consideration be given to the budget as turned back to the Recreation Committee, the Board would consider this incorporation. Mr. Kerschner thought this program would be a monetary problem if taken over by the Town. Some of the viewpoints expressed at the meeting were: The Youth Center working for the Town for many years, would like some recognition from the Town, but function separately. Another, was that the Town is growing, and this program would need more than volunteer help. Less volunteer help in years to come, would mean absorbing for more aid. Regionalizing (like the high schools), means a better program. The Chairman of the Youth Center said they would have to hire a Director and an assistant, to operate efficiently. They have \$3,000. to turn over to the Town if this incorporated. The Selectmen thought our Youth Program in town has been very successful on it's own, and should stay that way instead of bringing it into the Town Budget.

After meeting with the two committees, the Board of Selectmen discussed this incorporation. Mr. Kerschner read resolutions by Reed Hayes on this matter. Joel Davis made a motion, and it was unanimously accepted, that the Recreation Committee absorb the activities of the Youth Center, and the Board of Selectmen will investigate the legality of the Recreation Committee absorbing assets and liabilities.

Three letters were read by Mr. Kerschner dating April 11, 1972, from our Town Engineer, David Mylchreest. One, was the acceptance of the road from the intersection of Daisy Lane east, to the easterly boundary of Section E. The second, the sight distance at the intersection of Stagecoach Road, and Wagon Wheel Road. The third, was drainage on Millbrook Road. It was approved and passed to have Mr. Kerschner write a letter in conjunction with the Town Attorney, Thomas White, concerning Kurt Swartzkoff.

Mr. Kerschner has received the resignation of David Werblow from the Charter Study Committee. Mrs. Karol Paduch's name was brought forward to fill this vacancy. The Board of Selectmen approved the appointment of Karol Paduch, filling the vacancy of David Werblow on the Charter Study Committee. A Letter will be written to Mr. Robert Poliner presenting the Selectmen's regrets on Mr. Werblow's resignation, and also informing them of the appointment of Karol Paduch. A letter will be sent to Karol Paduch informing her of her appointment.

A letter was read from Dr. Chace, as Health Officer of Durham, approving our action with Commissioner Lufkin on the Gypsy Moth Aerial Spraying.

Mr. Kerschner read a letter from the Interlocal Agreement Advisory Board, regarding Durham's share of expenses to them. They stated that Durham owed for 1,020 yeds., removed from the landfill site. Mr. Kerschner has written to their board showing our share at \$.25 per yd.

Furnace repair and bidders for such, was then discussed. It was moved and passed, since Mr. Parmelee was low bidder, he would be accepted to install the furnace for a hot water system upstairs and downstairs.

The meeting adjourned at 11:00 P.M.
