BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING

April 15, 1982

The Board of Selectmen's meeting of April 15, 1982, was called to order at 7:35 P.M. by Acting First Selectman Maryann P. Boord; Gregory G. Curtis also present; M. Foster Mather absent. Townsperson Jim Clifford present.

Motion by G. Curtis to approve minutes of the Board of Selectmen's meeting of April 1, 1982; seconded by M. Boord; 2 ayes. No questions on weekly disbursements.

Correspondence:

Ira Kerschner has successfully completed a course of instruction for examining voting machines. Pursuant to Section 9-240a of the General Statutes, all voting machines must be examined 7 months to one year prior to each regular election of state officers. Ira will be charging \$60 per machine for the examinations. Others are charging \$90 for the first machine, \$70 for the next, plus mileage. G. Curtis moved the appointment of Ira Kerschner as Voting Machine Examiner for the Town of Durham; seconded by M. Boord; 2 ayes.

M. Boord moved the appointments of Geoffrey Colegrove, Donna Thomasson, and Joanne Salva to the Tourism Commission; seconded by G. Curtis; 2 ayes. April 21, 1982, will be the initial organizational meeting.

G. Curtis stated that he had investigated the suggestion by Frank Behrens for tree removal on the town green and was not in favor of removing the large trees. They are healthy and he sees no reason for removal. He further suggested pruning, rather than removing the yews which are growing into the monument. The pruning should take place now before the growing season is underway.

G. Curtis also mentioned a concern of Stuart Keating's in regard to the Little League fields. Stuart said that clay should have been put in all the fields last year and was not done. He is wondering if anything is going to be done about it this year.

M. Boord commented that she had checked with Joe Venuti in regard to his interest in remaining a member of the Recreation Committee. He would like to remain a member and will be able to be more active when he gets his "house fire"

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situation cleared up.

Motion by M. Boord at 7:50 P.M. to adjourn; seconded by
G. Curtis; 2 ayes.
