State Entomologist, John Anderson, responding to an inquiry from the Selectmen, has indicated that the gypsy moth infestation appears to be "rather light" in Durham, although, there may be some caterpillars." Based on this report, the Selectmen will not coordinate a cooperative spraying program as they did last year. However, home owners who wish to be certain about local infestation should check their own properties carefully. The Selectmen voted not to spray town property. The vote being 3-0.

The Selectmen have prepared a preliminary list of town roads which the Board will propose to Town Meeting to be accepted as the official roads of the town. The basis for the new list is the formal list maintained by the State and upon which reimbursement to the town is based. After final review with Town Counsel, the item will be added to the call for a future town meeting. The vote was 3-0.

Working with suggestions provided by the building inspector, the Board has reviewed, revised, and approved a new schedule of Building Permit Fees for the Town. The fee structure has been designed to provide for more adequate compensation to the town for the time of its Building Inspector. The principle addition to the fee structure is a basis for valuation of new construction, alterations, etc. If town meeting action is necessary, the item will be on the call of the next town meeting. The new fee's will be effective June 1, 1973. The vote was 3-0.
