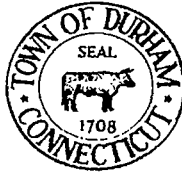

BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING

MAY 3, 1979

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. Present: Gregory G. Curtis, First Selectman; Lewis G. Hinman, Selectman; Betty C. Wakeman, Selectwoman; William Moore, Treasurer; Leland Seeton, Assessor; and, Mr. & Mrs. D. Thomasson, George Eames, Don Wiggins, and Ona McLaughlin.

Bids for Snow Plow, Plow Frame and Sander and Hydraulics were opened. Bidders were: Stephen Slaker Co. of Wallingford; Magovern Co. of Windsor Locks; Connecticut Truck & Trailer Service of North Haven; Tri-County Contractors Supply of Springfield; and R. W. Thompson, Newington.

Presentation was made by Donna Thomasson concerning the present revaluation of the town. Her letter was in behalf of all homeowners -- equal treatment for all homeowners in town, regardless of age of house. Mr. Richard Viagrande of Leshner-Glending and Assessor Leland Seeton were present. A lengthy discussion followed.

Minutes of previous meeting were approved. 3-0

Financial Report was reviewed.

Correspondence - letter to the Board of Finance concerning the Assistant Assessor, asking for \$709.42 to carry the office through June. Approved by the Board. 3-0

Jack B. Tinkel was appointed to the Library Board to fill vacancy with term to expire October, 1981. 3-0

Trailer business permit. Motion was approved to grant a permit to Jean Kowalski to set up a trailer on Route 79 at the Helmuth Brown property for the purpose of selling food, subject to the advice of the town attorney, and subject to the stipulation that trash be cleaned up every day.

Memorial Day - Special Constables must be appointed. Board approved this appointment. 3-0

Annual Budget Meeting agenda: Press release to be held until Tuesday, May 8th. Also, A. F. S. honorary citizenship award will be presented that evening to Anne Sorensen.

Three members of D.M.I.A.B. will be elected that night.
