Board of Selectmen Minutes Special Meeting June 6, 1974

1. Minutes of the May 23rd Meeting were approved as submitted.
2. Approved the Proposed Sewage Disposal Ordinance submitted by the Health Director with the exception of the schedule of fees as it relates to Review of Soil Erosion Plans which was deleted from the proposal. It was further agreed that Section 6 of the proposed ordinance should be rewritten if the Town Counsel determines that there is statutory authority for the Health Director to establish regulations and or amend such regulations by a duly warned public hearing.
3. Approved the proposed ordinance regarding the filing of maps in the municipal records and designated on the copy presented as municipal ordinance "A".
4. Approved the request from the Connecticut Agricultural Fair to use the Green and close off Town House Road during their Fair to be held on July 26th, 27th, and 28th 1974.
5. Authorized the First Selectman to make a special townwide mailing regarding the proposed ordinances.
6. Voted to table the matter of awarding the pick up truck bids until the regular meeting of June 13, 1974. It was the opinion of the Board that some of the bids submitted did not include five tires with an extra wheel or a wood body.

1. MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE "A"

By vote of the legislative body of Durham, Connecticut, it is hereby required that all maps presented to the Town Clerk for filing in the municipal records shall:

- a) bear the approval of the Planning ^{and Zoning} Commission pursuant to the Commission's land Subdivision Regulations; or shall
- b) be accompanied by the following statement over the signature of the owner, to wit;

The undersigned declares that he is the owner of the parcel of land described on the attached map and that said parcel of land does not constitute a subdivision or resubdivision as defined by Chapter 126 of the General Statutes, 1958 Revision, as amended, of the State of Connecticut, which Chapter further provides for the imposition of a fine of not more than two hundred dollars for each lot sold or offered for sale or so subdivided without the approval of the planning commission pursuant to the duly adopted Subdivision Regulations of the Commission.
