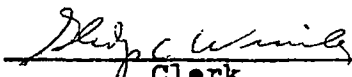
The Selectmen met and paid the bills. They discussed the merits of a committee to study all points of the P.A. 490 law and appointed A. Reed Hayes, Craig Pearson, Donald Soule, Joseph Venuti, Patricia Berten, Carl Otte, George Gulielmetti, one member of the Board of Assessors, and one member of the Planning and Zoning to the committee. Mr. Kerschner is to call the first meeting. They are to report to the Selectmen by Sept. 1st.

Mr. Kerschner reported on a County Selectmen's meeting that he attended. The Probate Judge's expenses were discussed at that meeting. His budget is as follows - Rent 5,747.00, electricity 345.00, custodian 900.00, insurance 138.00, carpet 600.00, other 4,625.00 making a total of \$ 12,355.00. Middletown cut their share of 72.56% from 8,964.79 to roughly \$ 6,000.00. Durham's share is 8.15% - 1,006.93. Our Board of Finance allowed \$900.00 in our budget for the coming year. Mr. Kerschner made a motion that we withhold payment until it is determined what all the towns involved are going to pay.

The Building Inspector, Joseph Suchanek attended to discuss the Basic Building Code regulations and the administrative regulations.

Mr. John Sta⁴¹ presented a proposition from the Town of Westport concerning the dumping of their refuse in Durham for a set fee per load for one year. The Selectmen turned the proposal down.

They adjourned until June 17, at 6:00.
