BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING

June 11, 1981

The Board of Selectmen's Meeting of June 11, 1981, was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by First Selectman M. Foster Mather; Board members present: Maryann P. Boord, Selectwoman; Gregory G. Curtis, Selectman. Townspeople present: M. Clark, C. N. Otte, W. Moore, J. Martinelli; constables: A. Dudley, S. Dudley, L. Hall, E. Vance, H. Tiedemann, H. Yeomans, N. Dale, Sr., M. Pearce, Jr.

The minutes of the previous meeting of May 28, 1981, were approved; motion by F. Mather; seconded by M. Boord. The weekly disbursements were so noted. General correspondence was so noted including the Tax Collector's letter to J. Clementel dated 6/8/81.

The First Selectman advised the Board of Selectmen that ads are placed for seasonal and full-time highway personnel.

The resignation of Donald Umlauf from the Economic Development Commission was accepted.

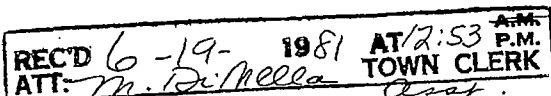
The Board of Selectmen authorized the First Selectman to sign an Agreement with the Middletown Transit District as revised by the Town Council's office; motion by G. Curtis; seconded by M. Boord; approved.

Update on Durham Poultry Farm: Dr. Willett and Town Council are preparing an abatement order citing public nuisance: flies and ground water pollution.

The First Selectman reported on the Flood Mitigation Plan that Midstate Regional Planning Agency and the Planning and Zoning Commission have already implemented part of and a public notice will be in the paper describing the areas involved. The community can appeal the plan.

Re request for special vendor's permit to Merle Ackert: The First Selectman advised the Board that he had made an executive decision to grant the permit due to Mr. Ackert's anxiety to start his business and the First Selectman requested the Board of Selectmen's approval; so moved by G. Curtis; seconded by M. Boord.

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F. Mather nominated Judith J. Frawley to a term to expire December 31, 1981, on the Economic Development Commission to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Donald Umlauf; seconded by M. Boord; passed.

Motion by F. Mather to appoint Henry Coe and Edward N. Hinman to a Planning and Zoning ad hoc committee which has been directed to study high density housing (mainly elderly housing) in Durham; seconded by M. Boord; passed.

The First Selectman stated it was necessary to approve the proposed charter revisions as presented at public hearing on May 28, 1981; so moved by M. Boord; seconded by G. Curtis; approved.

The following summer schedule of Board of Selectmen meetings was approved: no more meetings in June, July 9 and 23, August 13 and 27.

The list of Local Road Mileage as prepared by the State Department of Transportation as of 12/31/80 was signed by the Board of Selectmen.

A memo from the First Selectman dated 6/1/81 was distributed to the constables. The commitment and responsibilities of the constabulary were reviewed. Many points were discussed between the Board of Selectmen and constabulary and the following are some of the constables' requested improvements: da-glo orange traffic cones, mail drop in Secretary's office, different radio frequency.

F. Mather asked the constables to commit themselves to future duty for town events and a memo will be sent to the constables to this effect.

A. Dudley, H. Yeomans, H. Tiedemann were given notification of their placement on the inactive status list.

The meeting adjourned at 10:12 P.M.
