BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MTG. June 26, 1980

The Board of Selectmen's Meeting of June 26, 1980, was called to order at 7:32 p.m. by First Selectman, M. Foster Mather; Board members present: Maryann P. Boord, Selectwoman; Gregory G. Curtis, Selectman. Others: William Moore, Harry Tiedemann, Harry Yeomans, Joseph Banack, Malcolm Pearce, Elijah Vance, Ralph Moeller, Linda Dean, Ona McLaughlin, David Goldner.

The minutes of the June 5, 1980, Board of Selectmen's Meeting were unanimously approved. No questions on weekly disbursements or foreman's report but discussion followed on various drainage projects in town.

The constables requested clarification and support from the Board of Selectmen as to schooling, scheduling, and related matters. F. Mather stated that the constables had been advised before their appointment that the Selectman's office would not pay a constable to do scheduling for outside work. H. Tiedemann requested a minimum of four hours pay each time a constable goes on a job and a raise to at least \$7.00/hr. F. Mather stated it is up to the constables to organize themselves and he would prefer a force of 6-8 good constables willing to work; he will investigate the schooling matter.

William Moore advised the Board of Selectmen that there is \$1,989.77 in uncommitted Anti-Recession funds and interest. The board agreed to recommit the money and this item will be on the Agenda of the July 10, 1980, Board of Selectmen's Meeting.

Several items of miscellaneous correspondence were reviewed by the Board of Selectmen.

Motion by G. Curtis, seconded by M. Boord, to request legal opinion on the Zoning Board of Appeals letter dated 6/25/80; 3 ayes.

G. Curtis moved, seconded by M. Boord to make Maple Ave. from Rt. 68 to Old Cemetery Road one way, to close the remainder of Maple Ave. to Rt. 17 and Town House Road for Family Day activities on 6/29/80 with a raindate of 7/6/80; 3 ayes.

State Health Department correspondence (Vector Control Board)

was discussed with regard to the Tudor Egg Farm; who have been given 3 weeks to put the Control Board's recommendations into effect.

F. Mather moved the appointment of James McLaughlin to a term to expire 12/31/80 on the Economic Development Commission; seconded by G. Curtis; 3 ayes.

The First Selectman advised the Board of Selectmen of 2 upcoming summer projects: 1) resurface roof of shed; 2) paint outside of town hall. It was decided to put an ad in the paper requesting prices for these items.

By unanimous vote the meeting adjourned at 9:28 p.m.
