# **Continuation of Public Hearing**

# Robert & Deborah Proctor, Requesting a 25' front yard setback variance from section 4.5.2 from the *Durham Zoning Regulations* to install a solar field, 414 Blue Hills Rd.

B. LaFlamme stated that a site walk had been conducted and noted that Mark Jungels and James Frazier were not present. B. LaFlamme then opened the hearing to the applicant. R. Proctor stated that he had no questions and thanked the board for their work. The board had no further questions or comments.

# Robert & Deborah Proctor, Requesting a 25' front yard setback variance from section 4.5.2 from the *Durham Zoning Regulations* to install a solar field, 414 Blue Hills Rd.

A motion was made by R. Francis, seconded by J. Scagnelli, to approve Robert & Deborah Proctor, a 25' front yard setback variance from section 4.5.2 from the *Durham Zoning Regulations* to install a solar field at 414 Blue Hills Road with the hardship cited as minimizing the number of trees to be removed.

#### **Discussion:**

- R. Francis stated that while he appreciates the applicant providing letters of support from neighbors, he does not believe the request demonstrates a true hardship. He noted that the justification is based on aesthetics, which may in fact create a greater visual impact from the road, and that approval under these circumstances could set a precedent he would not support. In his opinion, the application does not qualify as a hardship.
- S. McNulty stated that she agrees with R. Francis.

**Vote:** All in opposition. Motion failed.
