Chairman Erich Marriott appointed Sam Olmstead to be a full member in the absence of Richard Quay and Matthew Tobin as a full member in the absence of Elliot Fuessenich.

Approval of the Regular Meeting minutes of May 9, 2022, to specifically address the minutes of April 28, 2022 and the Special Meeting of May 12, 2022.

Chairman Erich Marriott said the minutes of the April 28 Special Meeting needed to be amended to reflect that the BOF did indeed vote on the Budget. Denise Raap said that Plumb Hill Playing Fields, Inc ((PHPF) will have a term of use to end on June 21, 2034.
