Disposal of Personal, Residential Documents ONLY

Commercial / Business Disposal is not Accepted

- Sensitive documents ONLY are eligible for shredding e.g. pay stubs, bank statements, medical records,
 personal identifying information, tax forms, etc.
- Non-sensitive documents may be routinely recycled in your standard recycling container and are NOT accepted at the shredding event - e.g. junk mail, magazines, books, cards, envelopes, school papers.
- Documents should be in secure bags / boxes which can support the weight of the material.
- Resident verification (driver's license) required.
- Container(s) or receptacle(s) used to deliver documents will NOT be returned.

WASTE REDUCTION COMMITTEE



Back-to-school is an exciting season. It also generates a significant amount of waste! In the US, between 35% and 45% of solid waste originates from schools—around 14,500 tons of waste gets discarded from public schools every day! 77% of all school supplies end up as waste. The average American school wastes an estimated 67 pounds per student per year in discarded school supplies and lunches.

To prevent unnecessary waste going to landfills and incinerators, please reduce, reuse and recycle!

- Try to buy items made from recycled content or sustainable materials and with minimal or recyclable packaging.
- Avoid single-use plastic—it can take 1,000 years or more to degrade, leaving behind microparticles that contaminate soil and water.
- Choose reusable lunch boxes, bags, and containers for waste-free packed lunches, which on average can save about \$250 per person per year!

Textile collection and more!

Did you know you can bring clean used clothing and textiles, including handbags, shoes, boots, blankets and curtains, to one of three bins at the Bantam Annex, the Town Hall, or the Litchfield Recycling Center for a second life and recycling?

In addition, the LRC can recycle many items that don't belong in your blue recycling bin—from used printer cartridges and scrap metal to batteries, cell phones, electronics, mattresses and motor oil. There's also a book exchange, a collection of eyeglasses for donation, and a Swap Shop for items in good condition and working order to find a new home.


Quadrennial Application (M3)

A tax-exempt application of charitable and of certain other organizations, is required by C.G.S. \$12-81 and \$12-87. Scientific, educational, literary, historical, or charitable institution, an agricultural or horticultural society, a cemetery organization, or a hospital society, or corporation or sanatorium must file a return every four years. An additional report must be filed in any assessment year that is not a required filing year when seeking exemption for property acquired or previously not exempt. Applications must be filed with the assessor in each town in which exempt property is situated and owned on the assessment day, October 1. Applications must show all property for which exempt status is sought, and must be filed with the assessor on or before November 3, 2025.

Please return a completed application along with applicable 501C3 paperwork, Mission Statement, IRS Form 990 and Charter/bylaws.

The application must be filled out in its entirety to be considered for approval.
