



Compost your pumpkins!

Now Halloween is over, you can bring your pumpkins to the Litchfield Recycling Center to compost. (Heavy food waste in the garbage is expensive to send to the incinerator or landfill, where it contributes to noxious greenhouse gases instead of being returned to the soil.)

Tips for the Holiday Season

Americans produce 25% more waste over the holiday season. That's an extra one million tons of trash—including gift wrap and packaging, decorations, and food waste—just between Thanksgiving and New Year!

According to ReFED, on Thanksgiving day Americans will throw away about 316 million pounds of food, worth more than \$556 million, (and also wasting the 100 billion gallons of water and other resources it took to produce, transport and package the food.) As you get ready to celebrate, use these easy ways to be lighter on your wallet and the planet:

- Reduce food waste by sticking to meal plans and shopping lists
- Make the most of leftovers
- Compost food scraps instead of throwing food waste in the trash, bring it free of charge to the Litchfield Recycling Center to be turned into compost.
- Choose decorations you can use year after year
- Reuse gift bags and ribbons
- Recycle—glitter-free, non-laminated paper bags and wrapping paper as well as thin cardboard gift boxes can go in your blue recycling bin.
