## **ANNUAL TOWN MEETING MINUTES**

June 5th, 2025

## 7pm

The Annual Town Meeting was called to order by First Selectman, Dana Barrow, Jr. at 7:07pm. Present were Dana Barrow, Jr., First Selectman, Michael Guernack, M. Bart Laws, Selectman, David Zito, Treasurer, Wendy O'Connor, Admin to the First Selectman, Sharon George, Town Clerk, Ruben Manning and members of the audience.

1. To elect a moderator. First Selectman Barrows called for nominations.

Motion to nominate Ruben Manning was made by Jason Beaumont, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Linda Rollin.

No other nominations and nominations were closed.

Motion carried unanimously.

Moderator Rubin Manning begins by thanking the citizens of Scotland for coming and wishes to review the meeting rules before proceeding.

To consider and act upon the budget of the General Government and levy a tax on the Grand List of October 1, 2024, of \$154,958,370. subject to state mandated tax rates for the Motor Vehicle Grand List of \$14,004,760. Real Estate and Personal Property are due in 2 installments over \$100 on July 1st and January 1st. Motor Vehicle bills are due July 1st. Motor vehicle supplemental bills are due January 1st.

Discussion was held. John Beck spoke on the "Code Red" system and his desire to not cut this valuable service to the town. This is currently costing the town \$4500 per year and only 500 residents have registered. Without this system there is no easy way to alert residents to any emergencies in town. Wendy Sears suggested that if political parties can locate individuals for free that there might be a way the town can do it as well. Jolene Bowers informed the residents that the town is working on an email database for all other information to get to residents.

Discussion: Sera Gadbois questioned the teacher student ratio in the classrooms and some of the statistics of test results of the students in Scotland. Valerie Bruneau, Superintendent, addressed these questions and explained that these numbers change based on grade. She also spoke about the benchmarks that the students have achieved and said they are not quite where they would like to be but are diligently working towards those goals. She also stated that they have had a 0% budget increase by eliminating 1 teacher and that is because grades 2/3 will be combined.
