As before, you will be provided the capability to observe the meeting remotely, but there is no remote inter-active feature. One of the new agenda items concerns the income threshold for elderly and disabled citizens' tax relief, which we are looking to raise in order to include tax relief for a wider range of qualifying taxpayers.

The fine arts talent in our area is simply amazing and having the opportunity to see so much of it all at one time was a wonderful experience. Many of these artists are our friends and neighbors, and I love getting to know them further through their unique artistic visions.
