Operating Your Business from Home - Legally!



During the pandemic, many people shifted their patterns of life and work in response to the challenges that faced the world. One of these changes was an uptick in the number of individuals operating small businesses directly from their homes. While work-from-home has been a positive change for many, operating a business from a property that is zoned residential is not permitted under town zoning regulations. In some circumstances, however, businesses can be run from a residence - if you receive a Special Permit for "Home Occupation" from the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Home Occupation special permits can be issued to businesses operating on residential properties, but there are several conditions on which this approval depends. The business must be located entirely in a residential dwelling, not be the primary use of the building (occupying no more than 25% of the building's area), and cannot alter the building in any visible way that would make it out of character with surrounding residential dwellings. These regulations and others, such as the types of agricultural operations and equipment permissible for a home occupation, are outlined in full in the Town of Winchester's Zoning Regulations, available online at townofwinchester.org.

If you are currently operating a business out of your home, the office of Planning and Community Development advises you to make an application for Home Occupation at your property as soon as possible. Doing so will allow you to bring your home into compliance with zoning regulations and avoid any possible enforcement actions in the future. If you have questions about whether your work qualifies as home occupation, please feel free to call the Planning Office at (860) 738–6593.
