

Adopted: Infrastructure Investment Plan



On May 28, 2022, registered voters and property owners in Winchester headed to the polls to vote on two items: the annual town budget and the town's proposed Infrastructure Investment Plan. Both of those initiatives were adopted at referendum. The Infrastructure Investment Plan, as it was adopted, will invest \$18.3 million Town dollars into Winchester roadways, as well as another \$6.4 million state and federal dollars. The Town estimates that this plan will take at least five years to execute, and Town officials and advisors will be working diligently to ensure that the projects move forward in a way that gets the most for our money in these difficult economic times. Winchester's Prescription Drug Discount Program



Did you know? Winchester belongs to the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities (CCM), which offers a free prescription discount card program. This card may be used by any resident in town and saves an average of 45 percent off the retail price of medications, as well as providing discounts on vision, LASIK and hearing care services. It's especially valuable for people without health insurance or a traditional pharmacy benefit plan, or for patients with prescriptions not covered by insurance. 2021 and 2022 have been a huge year for Winsted businesses: In that timeframe, we have seen the opening of the Railway Cafe, Live Be You, Be Under Par, and 2nd Home to name a few, and we've also seen the reopening of Laurel Lanes under new management, the relocation of Asa's Place with expanded hours, and we've heard of the Little Red Barn's plans to expand. In the past couple months alone, we've also had Live At Home, a home good store, open at 58 Main Street, and Cura Di Se, a protein shake shop, has opened next door. Rooted Market has rebranded, and the American Museum of Tort Law is once again open with regular hours. The Mad River Market is opening an official office on Elm Street, and the American Mural Project open with regular visiting hours to the public.

Winsted's Main Street and downtown corridor is on the rise, and the Town continues to offer small \$10,000 forgivable loans to new businesses that choose to open in town. 150+ Winsted Cats



As most have now heard, the Town of Winchester took possession of over 150 cats, 2 dogs, and a ferret as part of an animal hoarding case in town. Municipal governments are required by state law to care for animals that are seized from homes in this manner, which meant that an enormous amount of time, energy, money, and love needed to go into the Town's response to this tragic situation. Scores of volunteers have assisted with the care of the cats as they were held in a temporary shelter at the now-decommissioned Batcheller School, and even more from around the town, region, and state donated supplies to the cause.

Now comes the truly hard part: making sure that these cats are able to stay healthy and be placed in a happy and loving forever home. The Town incurred thousands of dollars of costs associated with veterinarian care for these cats, and there are a few more bills to come following spaying and neutering efforts. If you are able to do so and would like to help these cats, we encourage you to make a monetary donation by cash or check made out to "Town of Winchester, CT" with "Animal Care" in the memo line. Cash can be dropped off at Town Hall (338 Main Street, Winsted, CT 06098), or checks can be dropped off or mailed to that address. We thank you in advance for your support!

As of the time that this article was written (Tuesday, June 28), most of the cats had been placed in shelters or were lined up for adoption.
