### Town Starts Work on Federal IIJA Applications



In late 2021, the federal government adopted the Infrastructure, Investment, and Jobs Act (IIJA) that dedicated \$550 billion to new infrastructure improvement projects on top of regularly-recurring infrastructure investments. The programs that have been established under this Act are generally competitive, meaning that individual states, counties, and towns must apply for this funding from the federal government. The Town of Winchester has applied to and been accepted into a program, run by the National League of Cities, that will provide free logistical help to the team of town staff members in Winchester that will be applying for IIJA funding for new projects. Monies received from

the IIJA competitive applications will be used in tandem with bonded monies approved by the Town referendum this past May to improve essential infrastructure.

### Did You Know? Quick Permitting Guidelines: Are you aware that many (if not most) major home and property improvements require permits from various

Town departments? Any demolitions, moving of earth, land clearing within 100 feet of a wetland or watercourse, and more requires Inland Wetlands permits. New structures, new uses of land, erection of signage, placement of outdoor lighting, expansion of parking areas, movement of earth, work on steep slopes, clearing more than 1/2 an acre of land, and more requires Zoning permits. New constructions, the installation of windows, plumbing work, electrical work, and more requires Building permits. The Town also issues other types of permits for other modifications that may be made to a given property. If you're not sure where to start or what kinds of permits you might need, please contact our new Building Official, Bill Pietrefase, at wpietrefase@townofwinchester.org, or our Inland Wetlands/Zoning Enforcement Officer, Michael Stankov, at mstankov@townofwinchester.org, for more information about what kinds of permitting your desired improvement work requires.
