Town Receives Congressional Grant Awards

In early 2023, Town staff busily worked to submit eight proposals for funding to Connecticut's congressional representatives through the Congressionally-Directed Spending program. The review process is meticulous and challenging, with only a handful of municipalities from each state receiving any amount of funding each year out of thousands of requests that are submitted. Of these eight submitted by the Town of Winchester, two were successfully approved for funding by Congress in December: the first is \$850,000 to upgrade police and public works radios to ensure maximum connectivity in all parts of town, and the second is \$2,530,000 to help construct a new Public Works facility, as our current facility has significant structural challenges that require urgent attention.

While the Board of Selectmen still needs to vote to accept these grants, and more work is needed to locate additional funds to support the much-needed new Public Works facility project, these awards represent \$3,380,000 of investment in the Town without burdening local property taxpayers, and the Town receiving an unprecedented two funding awards from Congress underscores the amazing work being done here in Winchester and Winsted. A special thank you to our representatives in Congress: Senator Chris Murphy, Senator Richard Blumenthal, and Rep. John Larson!

Can It Last? Yes It Can!



In June of 2022, we were thrilled and humbled to receive featured attention from the Wall Street Journal in an article entitled Rural Counties are Booming, but Can It Last?, written by Sarah Chaney Cambon and Andrew Mollica. The article highlighted an influx of new residents 15% higher to areas such as our own compared to metropolitan zones, a 52% overall spike in job postings joined by a 6.3% annualized raise in wages and a significant increase in school enrollment by the end of 2021.

As we head into 2023 with great momentum, we want to take a brief retrospective look of our own to provide the Wall Street Journal with our initial answer.

There's a vital aspect of any booming town that we believe was missed in the June article that deserves a focus in our response: care and investment in the community.

In 2022, the Town awarded 26 local businesses a total of \$250k through the Façade Improvement Program and 11 local businesses a total of \$100k through Business Start-Up Program. These investments, provided through ARPA and private grant dollars, were matched by over \$1.5 million in private investment, representing a total \$1.8 million investment 2022 through this program alone. The Town was also awarded over \$5 million in competitive grants in 2022, significantly increasing outside investment in our town.

As a means of services, the Winsted Senior Center provides its members with meals, event celebrations, programs, trips, and fitness classes such as Chair Yoga, Qigong/Tai-Chi, and Mindfulness/Relaxation all geared towards healthy aging. Our Recreation Department saw just under 1500 participants in our town's sports and events for the year. In addition to responding to emergency calls, welfare checks, and town concerns, our Emergency Services departments conduct regular town-wide celebrations like the Fireman's Carnival and Trunk-or-Treat, and community outreach programs like our most recent Stuff-A-Cruiser toy drive. Thanks to the generous donations of residents like you, our Resident Assistance Fund has been able to help provide key necessities for those most impoverished and in need in our community.

While the numbers outlined in the Wall Street Journal article were optimistic for our town and region, the reality of the care and investment going into our community is what has really made this past year special. As we charge in 2023 together, facing new challenges and opportunities, we believe that the resounding answer our community's actions provide to the question of "can it last?" is "yes, it can!"


