In the Works for Winsted

The Town of Winchester has secured a \$2.53M grant from Congressionally-Directed Spending to build a new public works garage, replacing many facets of the current structure whose first construction dates back to the 1940's. The town is also set to receive \$850k in federal aid to replace emergency responder radio systems which are currently ailing after having been in continuous use for over 20 years.



Connecticut's Sen. Chris Murphy paid a special visit to announce the grant awards and tour the current public works garage before delivering remarks to the public at the Gilson Café & Cinema. Sen. Murphy spoke on the northwest region's need for more adaptive reuse of older buildings, mental health care, and transportation before taking questions.
